PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Last week of term

Next week is the last week of Term 2 with school finishing at 2:30pm on the Friday. It is a very important week for all students as assessment tasks will be due and there will be limited opportunities for teachers to grant extensions to submission dates so it is vital that all students are focussed on their work requirements right up to Friday June 24. Term 3 will commence on Monday July 11 and students will move into the Semester 2 timetable. This will entail minimal changes with some students moving to new elective subjects and Year 7 students changing to their next block of term based modules. The holidays are a great opportunity for everyone to spend some time with family and friends but it is also important that enough time for rest and relaxation is set aside so that everyone begins Term 3 feeling fresh and energised.

Availability of electives

Some students have found that the electives they would prefer to do in Semester 2 may not be available to them as they have not paid fees required for their Semester 1 choices. The school only charges for materials that students are able to use and take home in the form of finished products from classes like Woodwork and Home Economics. Parents are strongly encouraged to make the required payments so that students can access their first choice of subjects for both semesters. It is possible to enter into a payment plan arrangement by contacting the office.

Traffic disruptions around the school

Works commenced this week on the roundabout at the corner of Olympic Parade and McKenzie St West meaning that there will be disruptions to traffic flow for parents and buses. The contractors completing the works have worked with the City of Greater Bendigo and the bus co-ordinators to ensure that there continues to be safe and timely arrangements in place for all pedestrians and road users. There will, however, be times when traffic flow will be slower than usual and everyone's support and patience is appreciated. There are a few reminders that all families need to be aware of to ensure that the planned new arrangements can be implemented effectively:

1. Maffescioni and Houlahan's buses will drop off and pick up from the front of the JB Osborne Theatre—car parking in that area will be limited
2. All other country buses will be dropping off and picking up from Collins St— parking in that area will also be limited
3. Town Bus ROUTE 55—new stop is Mockridge Drive
4. Town School Special Bus—new stop is Collins Street
5. All pedestrians and road users need to obey any temporary traffic management signs and personnel who may be on duty
6. The road works will continue until mid August so if you can find a detour or alternative travel arrangements you may avoid some inconvenience
7. We have been informed by our bus co-ordinators that bus pick up times will be adjusted as other schools will also be having an early finish for the end of the term. This means that Maffescioni and Houlahan's buses will leave the College at 2.20pm and the remainder of the country buses will leave after 2.30pm.

The school is in regular contact with the road works contractors and the bus co-ordinators so please let us know if there are any issues that you need assistance to resolve during these alternative arrangements.

The College Deb Ball is being held tonight and promises to be another glamorous and exciting event for our young ladies and gentlemen. Tickets have been selling fast and the students have been working hard to learn their dance steps and presentation moves. 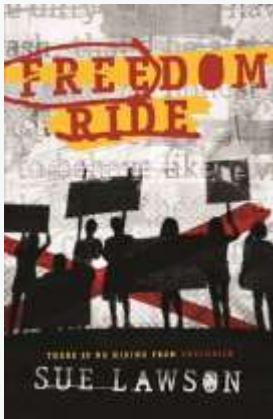

Freedom Ride by Sue Lawson

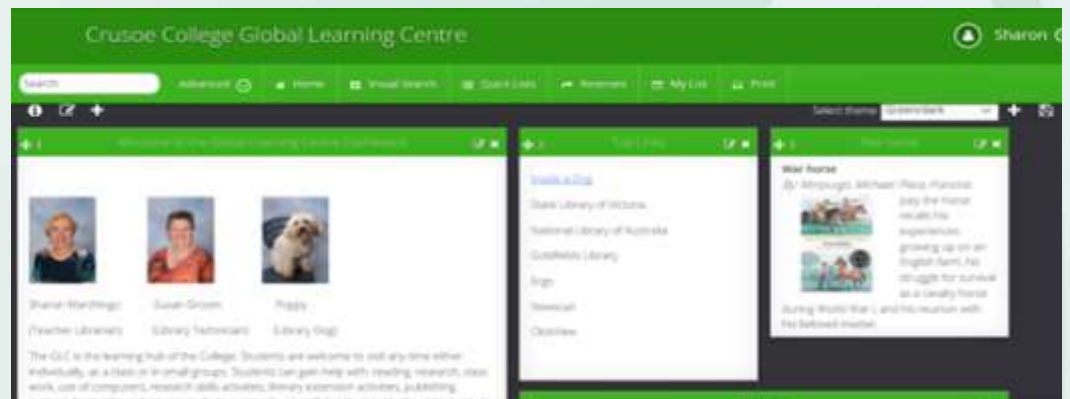
This is an engaging story set in central New South Wales during the 1960's. The book is written at the time of the Civil Rights movement and the Freedom Ride bus tour of New South Wales, a tour that was designed as a peaceful protest about the living conditions and treatment of aboriginal Australians. The main character of the book is Robbie who lives in a small town but has aspirations for a better life.

Robbie is the essential element to this story, as the reader is taken on his journey from: ignorance about aboriginal issues; to awareness and acceptance; to disappointment and anger; and finally action. He has an inspiring and noble mentor in his boss, Barry, who enlightens him about injustice, not only with indigenous people in his home town but his personal experience of lies and deceit at the hands of his father and grandmother.

This is a period in Australian history that is often not written about in fiction and readers may be shocked to learn about the level of discrimination and apartheid that existed in regional Australia at that time. It is important to remember that this was happening only 50 years ago and in many parts of Australia resentment and ignorance still exists.

This book has been short-listed in the Older Reader category for the Children's Book of the Year awards because of the compelling nature of the narrative and the important subject matter. It would make an excellent read for students studying Year 10 History.

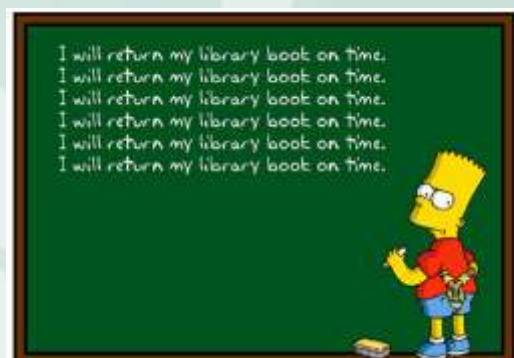


Access-It Update

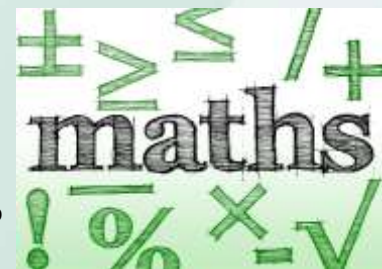


COMPASS—Tech Tips for Parents and Guardians

Students answer Mathematics questions from all areas of Maths for their year level. The competition will be completed under exam conditions for 75 minutes on Thursday, 28th July.



All students receive their results and Certificates of Participation, Credit, Distinction or High Distinction. This is an excellent opportunity for students to challenge themselves in an Australia-wide Mathematics competition. All students who wish to take part are encouraged to give it their best effort.
