Parent survey

Many thanks to those parents who completed and returned the DE&T survey over the last two weeks. Early next week, the completed surveys will be sent for collation and analysis with the results to be provided in aggregated form to the College during term 4. The information we receive gives us specific areas on which to focus our efforts to improve the school's operations and to give parents opportunities to be involved in and support the education of their children. If you have a survey and have not yet completed it, we would be most appreciative if you could return it to the College on Monday.

School improvement works

On Friday of last week under the leadership of Sam Hammond, over 100 trees were planted at the front of the school. Some Year 7 students assisted with this task and will be able to watch the growth as they enter the school each day in the coming years. This was a project that was supported by Bunnings Kangaroo Flat who provided the trees and tools as part of their community engagement program. Thanks also go to Daryl Lowndes and Gwenda Pratt who spent a lot of time in the rain setting up the area for the students to be able to complete the planting. At the same time last Friday, a group of students led by School Councillor, Trevor Cox, were busily working to paint various sections of the JB Osborne Theatre. This was another Bunnings sponsored project as we were generously provided with paint and brushes to freshen up the look of the foyer and toilets. Special thanks for the work done go to Trevor Cox and the skilled students who augmented their studies in building and construction with some practical work experience.

Managed Individual Planning (MIPs) Interviews

On Tuesday of last week we had many parents and Year 10 students come through the College to discuss their chosen pathways and subjects selections with their Advisor teachers and teachers from Bendigo Senior Secondary College. As a result of the work on the day, the overwhelming majority of students now have their enrolments completed and a link to BSSC established so that information on transition and 2017 programs can start to be provided to families. Well done to Chantelle McMillin, who co-ordinated the day, the Year 10 Advisors who met with all students, and thanks to all the families

who gave their time to ensure that students have completed this important step in their educational pathway. Those who were unable to attend on the day are encouraged to contact the relevant advisory teacher to ensure that all arrangements can be completed.

Students in the community

Our students do a wonderful job in contributing to their community in a range of ways through school, and no doubt would be involved in a variety of community activities outside of school time. We have students supporting elderly residents at Carshalton House through the Advance program and most people would remember seeing the contributions made by Crusoe students and staff at ANZAC ceremonies earlier in the year to name a few. We also have a regular stream of requests from local schools to have student leaders support curriculum and extra-curricular activities. As a result, our students have been commended for their ability to work with younger students in classroom activities, leadership training and sporting contexts.

Fee payments

We appreciate the effort that parents and carers put into budgeting for the cost of school resources. The majority of these costs are incurred at the start of the school year but there are some charges that families have chosen to defer through payment plans, and other optional charges such as participation in instrumental music programs, that require ongoing payments to be made. It is important that these charges are paid as the College is required to make payments to suppliers for associated goods and services. If payments are not made by those who access the services or goods, it puts pressure on other budgets within the College. Family statements will be distributed shortly and it will be greatly appreciated if families can make the required payments as soon as possible.

CAITLYN STEER 9F

The Ipsen Community and Crusoe College are very proud of the efforts of our Year 9 student Caitlyn Steer.

Caitlyn took up an interest in Orienteering when she was just 8 years of age despite initially thinking 'orienteering' meant picking oranges! Caitlyn quickly started to understand what orienteering really involved as she learned the skills required in the sport with her family.

In 2010, Caitlyn joined the Bendigo Orienteering Club and was a keen competitor in the W10 (under 10 girls division). She worked her way through the course requirements and levels to develop and refine her ability.

Caitlyn first made the Victorian Orienteering team in 2014 when she was in year 7. That year she represented Victoria at the National competition held in Western Australia. In 2015 Caitlyn again made the Victorian team after finishing 3rd in the SSV (State Schools Victoria) competition held in Ballarat.

2016 has found Caitlyn representing Victoria again. This time National Orienteering Championships will be held in September in QLD. Caitlyn says she loves the challenge of orienteering as it gives her the ability to 'go off track in the bush and exercise mentally and physically'.

Kiet started dancing when he was 6 years of age with Sharon Saunders Dancers in Bendigo. Over the years he has learnt tap, jazz, contemporary and ballet. As he got older, Kiet decided that he would concentrate on ballet hoping to develop a career as a dancer.

It was at Sharon Saunders Dancers that he began private lessons with Chris Ead who has an extensive dance resume. Chris is from Bendigo and danced with many Ballet Companies. This was invaluable as he learnt many male ballet techniques. June of 2015 Kiet was invited to audition with Melbourne City Ballet elite junior extension program. He was very nervous at the audition and at the end of it he was offered a position in the program. He travelled to Melbourne every Saturday up until Christmas enjoying the experience. In 2016 Melbourne City Ballet moved to their new modern equipped studio in Coburg where Kiet still attends the program every Saturday. MCB also has a youth ballet which is separate to the elite program.

Melbourne City Youth ballet is by audition only and is open to any dancer in Victoria under the age of 18 years of age. Kiet was encouraged to audition and has been accepted into the company. His first performance was 'Beauty and the Beast' where he danced the role of the Cavalier. The performance was for 2 days at Darebin Performing Arts Centre.

Kiet danced a Duet (Par de Deux) which was a new experience for him. Now he is part of the company his next performance is in October and the performance will be 'Snow Queen' where he will play the role of the wolf. Being part of Melbourne City Youth Ballet means travelling to Melbourne every 2nd Sunday and a week intensive program in the school holidays for rehearsals. Whilst other schools in Bendigo offered the performing arts course, Kiet wanted to stay at Crusoe College where he has many friends. Kiet feels comfortable in the school community and has been encouraged to tap dance for the students and staff in his community.

He also enjoys playing volleyball for the school. Kiet still enjoys dancing with Sharon Saunders Dancers and performs at their end of year concert. He also undertakes his dance exams with Sharon. Kiet has also won many awards for both troupe and solo dances against other dance schools. FRENCH

On Friday 22nd July, 20 Year 8 French students went to Bendigo Senior Secondary College Language Centre for a French Immersion Day, together with students from Eaglehawk and Weeroona Secondary Colleges. The day was hosted by Marie Boulanger, VCE French teacher, and several of her Year 11 and 12 students who acted as helpers.

Our students participated in several activities over the course of the day, including preparing, cooking and eating crepes; playing language games; building models of the Eiffel Tower from pipe-cleaners, paddle pop sticks and sticky tape; playing petanque (French bowls), and learning some French dancing.

Each Crusoe student was in a team with students from the other colleges; the teams were Croissants, Berets, Eiffel Tower, Tricolor and Escargots. They competed with the other teams for prizes in their activities.

The students all had the opportunity to enjoy a French morning tea of croissants, pain au chocolat, baguettes and Brie cheese, and platters of fresh fruit. The consensus of all the students who participated was that they enjoyed a wonderful day out, learnt some new French words, and made new friends.

Earlier in July, the Year 9 and 10 students attended BSSC for a French Transition morning. They participated in language activities, ate a French morning tea and had the opportunity to ask questions and listen to VCE French students talk about the

benefits of continuing with their LOTE studies into VCE.

Year 7 students have been busy, investigating French-speaking countries and territories across the world, preparing an identity card, and drawing up a real or imagined family tree. They have learnt how to play Battleships and Bingo in French.

In Term Four, we hope to combine all the Year 8 LOTE classes across the school to run the Amazing LOTE Race. Stay tuned for further developments.

We have been granted permission to start planning an overseas trip to New Caledonia for November 2017, in conjunction with Weeroona and Eaglehawk Secondary Colleges.

Preference will be given to Year 9 and 10 students, but enthusiastic Year 8 students will be considered. We will be capping the trip to a maximum of 10 students from Crusoe College. 'Expression of Interest' letters will be sent home in the next few weeks to all interested students and their families. Another thing we would be encouraging families to do is to host some fundraising activities to reduce the financial burden.

INDONESIAN

Our Year 8 students are busy learning about animals which will culminate in a trip to the Melbourne Zoo on Wednesday 31st August. The students will be collecting images and recordings as well as gaining a greater understanding of the zoo and the animals to be transferred into a picture storybook.

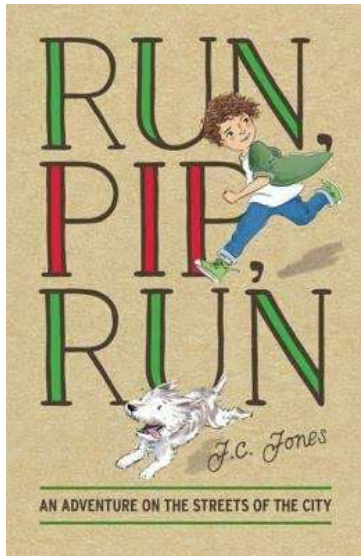

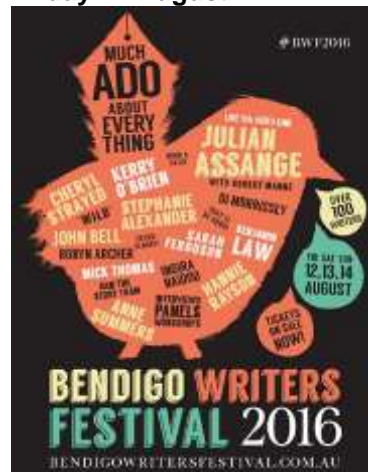
The GLC celebrating the Rio Olympics
